Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Has Christ been divided?

Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

For some years TUC has been supporting the Carlton Church of All Nations (CAN) Community Care program. We have used funds from Food for Friends to stock up their Community Pantry.

This is how CAN Community Care has helped one family from Tibet.

Nadir and her family live in the Carlton public housing estate immediately adjacent to CAN. For Nadir and her family, the ways of Australia were daunting and unsettling - very different from their former life in Tibet. Since joining the CAN Multicultural Women's Group, Nadir has grown in confidence, and now she can make new friends, practise her English, and share her Tibetan cooking.

Her family participates in the CAN Homework program and are also regulars at their Community Lunches. "CAN has helped us so much. We found friends here. It feels like home." — Nadir
