Skills, Opportunity, Survival in Kenya (SOSK)

SOSK is a not for profit charity organisation in Naivasha. They fund programs to promote the education of slum children and training for destitute women in Kenya. The SOSK objective is to offer these people the opportunity to learn skills for employability, relevant life skills and develop knowledge of fundamental health. This is achieved through:

- Providing a children's home/childcare and schooling facility in the slum area of Naivasha.
- Providing materials, training and infrastructure for the operation of a craft/clothing industry which trains and employs destitute women and children of Naivasha.
- Providing resources to train and educate women in prison.
- Providing water filtration systems and sanitation education to the most needy in Naivasha.

Their objectives are realised through their alliances with local Christian organisations.
